



Squiggly-Wiggly Worm,




Here to help you learn!

to move~




and you can do

But I have 5 pairs!




AND my skin

or ears, or eyes...




and here's another

Start with a Wiggly-Squiggle




Add a smile

Play with overlaps to make them smooth or twisty



Add highlights~

Try keeping the angle consistent



Rings tell the viewer which way they're going



find midline


add rings




